I. The Empty Tomb (V. 1-7)

- A. This lost world is still looking for a living Savior in dead places.
 - 1. They honor God for what He has done in the past but do not know what He is doing in the present.
 - 2. They grieve the works of man more than they celebrate the victory of God.

- B. The only cure for seeking God in dead places is the Word of God.
 - 1. We must be willing to hear it.
 - 2. We must be diligent to remember it.

II. The Resulting Message (V. 8-12)

- A. Belief in the living Savior Jesus means having a saving message for the world.
 - 1. This message must be told.
 - 2. This message must be believed.

- B. Having a saving message is a dangerous thing to possess in a lost world.
 - 1. We must be willing to suffer.
 - 2. We must be willing to "fail."

Discussion Questions

1. Read Luke 24:1-12.
2. What does it mean to "look for the living among the dead" in verse 5?
 - a. In what ways can we treat Jesus like He is still dead?
 - b. Why is it important that we honor Jesus as a living Savior and not a dead one?
3. What did the angels remind the women of in verses 6-8?
 - a. What does that say about the value of remembering what God says?
 - b. How have you been blessed by remembering what God says?
4. What did the women do when they came back from the empty tomb, according to verse 9?
 - a. What do you know about Jesus that you feel you have to share today?
 - b. Why is it important that believers in Christ testify about Him to nonbelievers?
5. What was the response to the testimony of the women, according to verse 11?
 - a. What does that tell us about what we must be prepared to suffer from people when we testify of Jesus?
 - b. What does that tell us about the possibility of rejection when we testify of Jesus?
6. Name one person in your life who is far from God.
 - a. How do you plan to go about having a spiritual conversation with the person?
 - b. What do you plan to do if that person is offended or does not believe you?
