

**The Blessing of Righteousness**  
**Genesis 15:1-6, Pew Bible p. 10**  
**February 15, 2026**

**I. Blessing and Doubt (V. 1-3)**

- A. God has promised immeasurable good to His people.
  - 1. His promises have more assurance than we could ever give.
  - 2. His promises have a bigger reward than we could ever receive.
  
- B. The greatest threat to God's good promises is our own unbelief.
  - 1. We feel they are too good to be true.
  - 2. We feel we would rather sin than have them.

**II. Faith and Justification (V. 4-6)**

- A. The greatest weapon against our doubt is faith.
  - 1. Faith must come through hearing the Word of God.
  - 2. Faith does not necessarily mean being doubtless.
  
- B. The greatest reward for our faith is our own justification.
  - 1. Justification means we have no guilt in God's eyes.
  - 2. Justification means we have great favor in God's eyes.

## Discussion Questions

1. Read Genesis 15:1-6.
2. Why do you think God reminds Abram so often of His promises, as He does in verse 1?
  - a. What promises of God are you reminded of constantly?
  - b. In what ways has God reminded you of His promises?
3. Have you ever doubted God's Word based on bad circumstances, as Abram did in verses 2-3?
  - a. What are some things you are still waiting for with hope that God will give them to you?
  - b. What are some things you are still waiting in hope for God to give?
4. What is the difference between complaining *about* God and complaining *to* God?
  - a. Which kind of complaining do you think Abram was doing?
  - b. How can we be careful to tell God our problems while not accusing Him?
5. Why did God merely remind Abram of his promise in verses 4-5 rather than grant Abram his request immediately?
  - a. What does this say about how important God's Word is when we doubt?
6. What is the significance to us today of God crediting righteousness to Abram just because of His faith?
  - a. Why is being righteous in God's eyes such a big deal?
  - b. How can we be made righteous today?
