I. Preparing for the Unknown (V. 1-9)

- A. God's people have liberty in uncertainty as long as they are faithful to God's character.
- B. God's people have liberty in uncertainty as long as they are obedient to God's Word.

II. Living in the Unknown (V. 10-14)

- A. When you don't know the way to go, use God's gift of practical wisdom.
- B. When you don't know the way to go, cover every decision in humble prayer.

III. Worship in the Unknown (V. 15-28)

- A. We can worship in the unknown because God knows far more than we know.
- B. We can worship in the unknown because God loves far more than we can imagine.

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Discussion Questions

1. Read Genesis 24:1-28.
2. Have you ever had to make a difficult decision, and you did not know which choice God wanted you to make?
 - a. What was this decision?
 - b. Why was it difficult?
3. What unknowns were there in Abraham's plan to send his servant to Haran to find a wife for Isaac?
4. In what ways did Abraham's servant use practical wisdom to find Rebekah and in what ways did He depend on prayer?
 - a. In what ways has God given you practical wisdom to make tough decisions?
 - b. How has God used your prayer life to help you make difficult decisions?
5. What does the servant finding Rebekah so quickly and easily say about God's love for Abraham?
 - a. What does it say about God's love for you?
6. How can you get better at both trusting God and making decisions where the future is uncertain?
7. Pray for our church members to trust God with the unknown and that God would give them wisdom and blessing. Come to the church prayer meeting this Wednesday from 6:00-6:30 pm in the Worship Center lobby.
